WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR

Thorough research on best practices

Under the leadership of Gent University, Best Practices in terms of integration policies were mapped at the EU and National level, with a specific focus on Greece. The synthesis report produced, set a solid basis for the design of capacity-building activities that will be implemented in the following weeks and months. Social integration of TCN's was examined through the following domains:

- · employment,
- · education.
- · health care.
- · social care,
- intercultural coexistence
 Best practices (availiable at LION's website)
 were mapped using the following tools:
 extensive desk research, focus groups and
 interviews with TCNs (asylum seekers and
 beneficiaries of international protection) and
 local stakeholders in Thessaloniki.
- Mapping the local field for implementing the proposed framework for integration

Through desk research and interviews with key social actors, the project team mapped the key field actors in Thessaloniki to prioritise the needs and collect information on the already existing practices in Thessaloniki in terms of social integration of Third Country National in the abovementioned 5 sectors. Challenges were identified and recommendations formulated in order to tailor the future activities of the project.

 Development of a tailor made methodological action plan

The aim of the plan is to:

- address the preconditions for the active participation of the TCNs to civic and cultural life:
- promote tolerance, non-discriminatory practices and encourage intercultural dialogues;
- identify the gaps and needs in public services towards a multicultural society;
- promote communication channels and their further development between TCNs and local society;
- foster TCNs' civic orientation and their needs for information regarding the history, fundamental norms and values of the host country;
- enhance the active participation of TCNs in collective bodies at local level in order to give them a voice:
- highlight the needed leadership skills of TCNs



NEXT STEPS

- Capacity building to the host society. Specifically, workshops/trainings will be organised for Frontline practitioners, hospital staff and police officers, also including 8 training activities for teachers and 6 info days for parents aiming at raising awareness of the network and spread its value.
- A multidisciplinary team will be also established which will provide psychosocial and legal support to TCNs. 3 trainings of 20 participants, lasting 6 hours each, will be organized for members of migrant and local communities.
- e Common activities will also take place aiming at networking TCNs and relevant stakeholders. TCNs along with members of the local community will visit basic points of the city, will interact with groups and associations of the local society and will jointly organise events on sports, art, music, culture etc. To further assist the networking processes a physical platform will be developed where key stakeholders and TCNs will participate in in a series of consultation meetings
